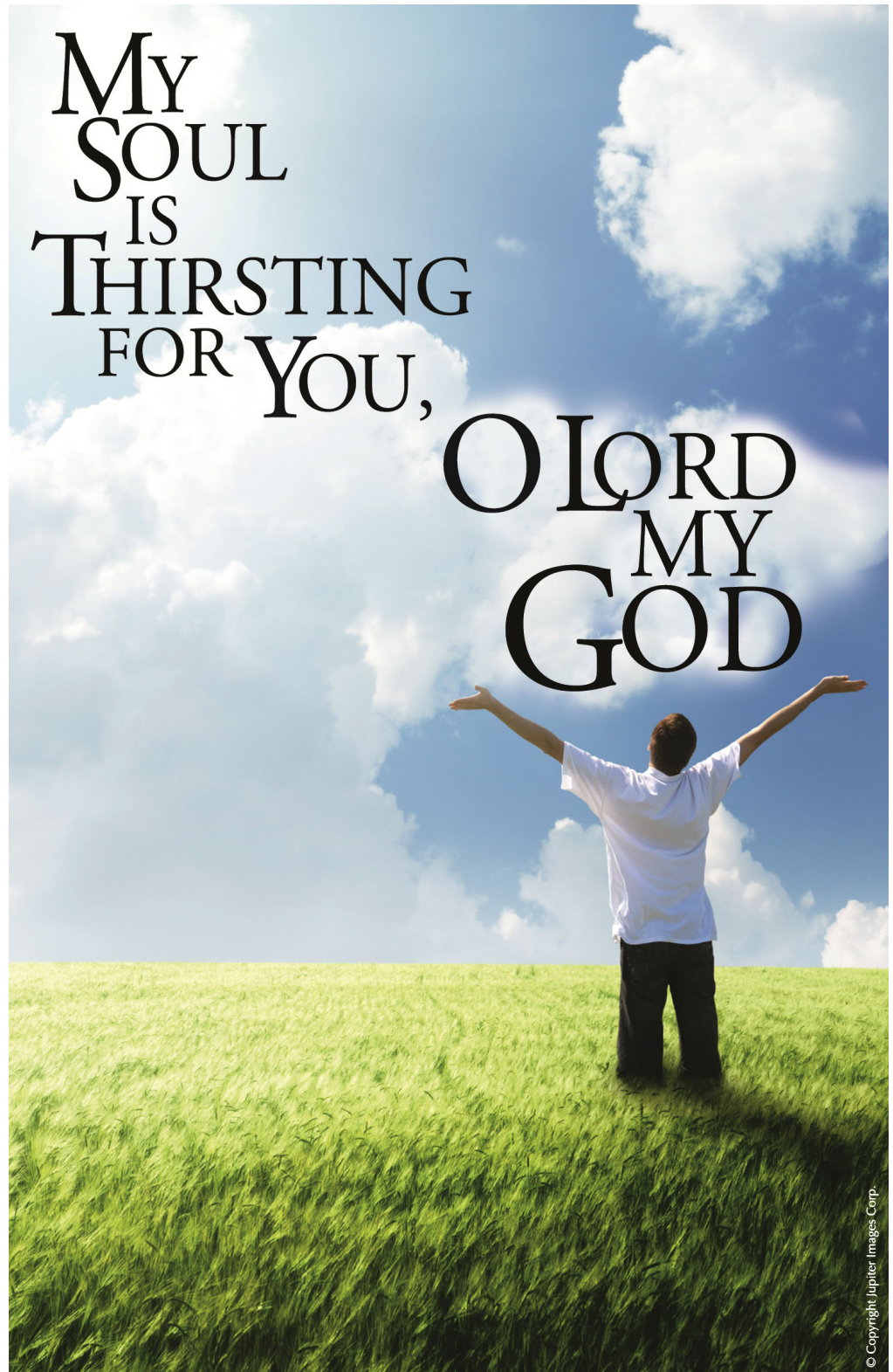

Parish Retreat

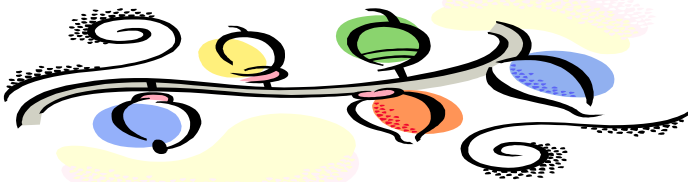

Rules for Flowers and Grave Decorations

Immaculate Conception Parish plants and cares for the trees and shrubs in the cemetery. **Planting by individuals is not permitted on lots.**

Glass or ceramic flower vases are not permitted in the cemetery. No other glass containers or objects (for example, candle holders) are permitted in the cemetery. **No potted plants, balloons, lawn ornaments or plaques are allowed.**

The Parish Cemetery Maintenance Committee will remove flowers and **all other grave decorations** periodically. To maintain the beauty of the cemetery, all decorations will be removed: **During the last weekend of October, in preparation for All Souls' Day.**

Placing of **benches** on gravesites is **not permitted**. The Cemetery Chapel has been constructed to provide a place of quiet and rest for cemetery visitors. The chapel is accessible to all visitors; parking is available on the lot next to the rectory.

New Revised Mass Program: Continues Tuesday, November 8th

The remaining sessions within the series are:

This program provides a complete catechetical series introducing the third edition of the Roman Missal. Within this series, you will find the answer to the question, “What is changing?” as well as explanations about why the Missal is changing. ↑ COPD Awareness Month

↑ COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease) is actually a combination of diseases, according to the American Lung Association website, which includes emphysema and chronic bronchitis. COPD is the fourth leading cause of death in the U.S. and affects 12 million Americans. While there is not a cure for this disease, it is treatable and early detection is important. COPD makes breathing difficult, blocking your airflow, especially when you exhale. It is a very serious disease and it is very important that the symptoms are not ignored. Most cases of COPD are caused by long-term smoking. Other cases can be caused by long-term exposure to dust, chemical fumes and air pollution. Once there is damage to your lungs, it is irreversible. Symptoms don't usually appear until there is significant lung damage, and this continues to get worse over time. The most common symptoms are shortness of breath, wheezing, chest tightness and chronic cough. Treatment focuses on symptom control. The best prevention for COPD is to not smoke and if you currently smoke, you need to quit. I understand it is easier said than done. That is why I have included resources to help you quit smoking. Pro-Life Committee Message

The Missouri Catholic Conference of Bishops (M.C.C.) reported recently that the U.S. House of Representatives had passed the “Protect Life Act”, H.R. 358, by a large majority, 251 to 172, with bipartisan support for the legislation. The M.C.C. gives much credit for this success to all those who contacted our representatives requesting their support for this law.

Now, this legislation moves to the U.S. Senate where “it will face fierce opposition” and the M.C.C. and the U.S. Conf. of Catholic Bishops (U.S.C.C.B.) are asking all of us once again to contact our 2 U.S. Senators and ask them to support passage of the “Protect Life Act”. The M.C.C. and the U.S.C.C.B. are working directly with the Congress to inform them of the church’s position on this issue and others, but they need our help.

The U.S.C.C.B. statement says, “The Protect Life Act would help protect vulnerable children, their families and doctors in several ways - - “, ie. federal funds won’t be used to subsidize elective abortions and it will provide conscience protections for doctors and other health care professionals. Please help by calling your senators soon

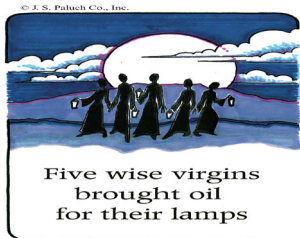
